The messenger who visited us [Joseph Smith and Oliver Cowdery] on this occasion and conferred this Priesthood upon us, said that his name was John, the same that is called John the Baptist in the New Testament, and that he acted under the direction of Peter, James, and John, who held the keys of the Priesthood of Melchizedek, which Priesthood, he said, would in due time be conferred on us, and that I should be called the first Elder of the Church, and he (Oliver Cowdery) the second.

I will now give you a description of the manner in which the Book of Mormon was translated. Joseph Smith would put the seer stone into a hat, and put his face in the hat, drawing it closely around his face to exclude the light; and in the darkness the spiritual light would shine. A piece of something resembling parchment would appear, and on that appeared the writing. One character at a time would appear, and under it was the interpretation in English. Brother Joseph would read off the English to Oliver Cowdery, who was his principal scribe, and when it was written down and repeated to Brother Joseph to see if it was correct, then it would disappear, and another character with the interpretation would appear. Thus the Book of Mormon was translated by the gift and power of God, and not by any power of man. ... At times when Brother Joseph would attempt to translate, he would look into the hat in which the stone was placed, he found he was spiritually blind and could not translate ... When in this condition he would go out and pray, and when he became sufficiently humble before God, he could then proceed with the translation.

... the subject [celestial/plural marriage], in connection with the great principles of baptism, redemption and sealings for the dead, became the great themes of his [Joseph Smith's] life ...

But, says one, how have you obtained this information [about plurality of wives]? By new revelation. When was it given, and to whom? It was given to our Prophet, Seer, and Revelator, Joseph Smith, on the 12th day of July, 1843, only about eleven months before he was martyred for the testimony of Jesus.

... I received a powerful and irresistible testimony of the truth of plural marriage ... Shortly afterwards I consented to become the Prophet's wife.

Early in the year 1842, Joseph Smith taught me the principle of marriage for eternity, and the doctrine of plural marriage. He said that in teaching this he realized that he jeopardized his life; but God had revealed it to him many years before as a privilege with blessings, now God had revealed it again and instructed him to teach it with commandment, as the Church could travel (progress) no further without the introduction of this principle.

... believing that their leader had received a revelation from God to practice this abomination [polygamy]. This was the first error that crept into the church. None of us detected it then. ... But we were young ... Brother Joseph and myself were only twenty-five years of age.

Joseph Smith repented of his connection with this doctrine, and said that it was of the devil. He caused the revelations on that subject to be burned ...

In the last, or in some public meeting, Joseph Smith, jr., said: if the people would let us alone, we would preach the gospel to them in peace; but, if they came to us to molest us, we

would establish our religion by the sword; and that he would become to this generation a second Mahomet.

I will lead you to the battle; and if you are not afraid to die, and feel disposed to spill your blood in your own defense, you will not offend me."

war, for which they were making every arrangement ... there are betwixt eight and ten hundred men, well armed and equipped, who have taken an oath to support Joseph Smith and Lyman Wight, in opposition to the laws of the State of Missouri, or otherwise, which said men are called Danites ... they expected to be fully prepared to commence war this fall, or next spring at furthest. ... the Danites aforesaid, are sworn to cowhide any person or persons, who may say aught against Joseph Smith and Lyman Wight, and if that will not prevent them from speaking about said Smith and Wight, then they are to assassinate them.
